# What are Brownfields?

"...real property, the expansion, redevelopment or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant."

Property that is, or may be contaminated

Once productive areas that are now abandoned

**Given Servire** Fear of environmental liability

The Result = Abandoned, Blighted Properties = BROWNFIELDS

## Brownfields Could Be ...

An ordinary, every-day view, such as an abandoned gas station.



# Or Brownfields Could be ...

- Former dry cleaners
- Factories, former manufacturing
- Warehouses
- Parking lots
- Lots where heavy machinery was stored or repaired
- Abandoned railroads
- Former railroad switching yards
- Air strips and hangers
- Bus facilities
- Landfills
- And...junkyards, textile mills, abandoned rail roads, mining areas, abandoned meth labs, former automobile refinishing, machine shops, former plastics manufacturing, scrap metal properties
- And many more types of properties.

#### EPA's Investment in Brownfields Grants

- Since 1995, EPA has awarded 3,100 Brownfields grants totaling more than \$924 million. This has helped:
  - Assess more than 17,000 properties.
  - Leverage more than \$18.3 billion in brownfields cleanup and redevelopment funding from the private and public sectors.
  - Generate more than 75,000 jobs.
    - Make more than 70,000 acres ready for reuse.

#### **Eligible Contaminants**

- Hazardous Substances
- Petroleum Contamination
- Asbestos & Lead Paint are eligible
- ✓ Illegal drug labs (e.g., Meth labs)
- Mine-Scarred Lands
- Other environmental contaminants

# Brownfields Assessment Grants



- > 3 year performance period
  CW-max. combined amt=\$400K
- SS-max. amt=\$350K
- Coalition-max. amt=\$1M
- No cost share

**Example eligible activities:** 

- Inventory Brownfields
- Phase I / II Environmental Assessments
- Cleanup / Reuse Plans

Community and Stakeholder <sup>8/21/2012</sup>Outreach





- > Applicant must own the site by proposal deadline date
- Applicant can not be potentially liable for contamination under CERCLA
- Non-profit organizations are eligible to apply
- Applicants may apply for funding at up to three sites
- Maximum funding per entity: \$600,000
- Applicants must have a Phase II ESA complete prior to submittal
- > 3 year performance period
- 20% Cost Share

Example eligible activities:

Cleanup

<u>State Brownfields Programs</u> (General Characteristics)

#### State Response Programs (VCPs,VRP, & Brownfields Program)

- Facilitates cleanup of contaminated sites
  - Helps resolve environmental concerns
  - Allows property owners to realize the full economic potential of their property
  - Program participants generally receive environmental liability protection from the state
  - Removes barriers for securing loans

# **Getting Started**

- <u>Assess your capacity to manage a</u> <u>Brownfields Grant</u>
  - Must Have the ability to contract/manage Environmental Consultants
  - Must Have a financial and accounting system to manage a budget, draw down funds, make payments and report accomplishments

# Identify Your Project Manager

 A dedicated energetic PM is often the difference between a successful or unsuccessful community.

- Retained for 3/5 yrs
- Replacement Plan-If not retained

# Basic Understanding our of guidelines

EPA Brownfields Grants Are Very Competitive. Applicants should be prepared to put time and effort into constructing a winning proposal.

Threshold Components-(Pass/Fail)

- Applicants and Sites are screened for eligibility
- Don't buy contaminated or perceived contaminated property without first conducting an All Appropriate Inquiry (Phase I ESA)

Ranking Components-(Scored Nationally)
